

For over 50 years, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes has believed that sports are much more than a game or pastime. Sports impact our culture and our world. More and more, the playing field is where young people discover what it means to be a man or woman. An astounding 38 million kids between the ages of 8 and 18 play competitive sports. And 93% of *Fortune 500* CEO's played sports in school. That's why, as the largest Christian sports ministry in the world, we remain passionately committed to our vision "to see the world impacted for Jesus Christ through the influence of athletes and coaches."

With the enormous pressures our youth and coaches face today, we believe that FCA is needed now more than ever. *Give 110%*. *Win at all costs. Do what it takes*. These are all expressions that can encourage going beyond the bounds of good sportsmanship. What about playing with *heart* – teamwork, hard work and integrity? But to develop athletes and coaches who play with heart, you've got to first feed their soul.



To reach and teach a nation what it means to play with heart and soul is a goal that we can achieve together. In 2006, thanks to you, our teammates, FCA reached more than 1.3 million for Christ. Our staff grew to 742 in 334 offices across the country. Our efforts focused on our "4 C's" of Ministry: Coaches, Campus, Camps and Community. With your greatly valued support, we are indeed putting *the heart and soul in sports*.



# **COACHES** Ministry

Coaches are often the most important adult role model in the lives of young people. Usually overworked and under-appreciated, their influence impacts thousands of athletes, students, parents and fans long after the final whistle. Through outreach events, training, resources and conferences, FCA encourages coaches to cultivate a biblical heart for coaching, for their players and for God.

In 2006, FCA hosted 26 exhibits, fellowships and worship services at 10 national coaches' conventions which were attended by more than 43,000 coaches. Hundreds came to Christ, and many took their first steps toward FCA involvement. In addition, we continued our Coaches Camps and marriage conferences, both designed to give coaches and their families a chance to enrich their lives together.

Also, new in 2006 was the launch of our Coaches Ministry Director School, in which staff with a passion to minister specifically to coaches are being fully equipped to do so. We also published the new Coach's Bible that includes 365 daily devotionals written just for coaches.

## **CAMPUS** Ministry

In 2006, FCA reached 331,150 student-athletes on 6,623 junior high, high school and college campuses in FCA groups called "Huddles." Student-athletes lead the Huddles, supported by coach and parent volunteers and FCA-designed resources. Participants gather to pray, encourage and learn practical ways to apply their faith. Our goal is to help them grow into mature men and women fully equipped to live and compete for Christ.

FCA's One Way 2 Play Drug Free program remains a potent force in a time when public schools have closed their doors to most Christian influences. Since this program began in 1991, students across the country have committed to playing alcohol and drug-free with 50,110 doing so in 2006.

Fields of Faith began in 2004, inspired by an individual FCA staff member. That year 6,000 students gathered on athletic fields in Oklahoma, Texas and Kansas to challenge each other to read the Word of God and come to faith in Jesus Christ. In 2006, Fields of Faith became a national event. An estimated 50,000 people across the country participated with 4,433 commitments to Christ and 8,019 committing to reading the Bible daily!

**CAMP** Ministry

2006 marked the 50th Anniversary of FCA's first sports camp in Estes Park, Colorado. Our commitment to providing "inspiration and perspiration" remains the same today. With attendance more than doubling in the last 5 years, 196 camps in 2006 were conducted nationwide with more than 33,546 participating!

FCA now offers six different types of camps. Sports Camps in sport-specific and multi-sport formats; Team Camps, in which coaches bring their entire teams to build unity; Power Camps for kids ages 8-12; Leadership Camps, which train students to be more effective FCA leaders on campus; Partnership Camps, in which we provide an FCA Camp experience to interested church and sports organizations; and Coaches Camps for coaches and their families, which help equip and refresh these role models. As always, we work with our regions to develop the camps best suited for their individual areas.

# **COMMUNITY** Ministry

At FCA we have a huge opportunity to reach the millions of youth who participate in sports and who are not reached through our current Campus or Camp Ministries. Our strategy is to minister to a community of people, coaches and athletes who are united around a particular sport outside of the traditional school setting such as club, league and church sports. We currently have established sport-specific ministries in golf, lacrosse, baseball, motocross, fitness and endurance sports.

Incredibly important are the thousands of community volunteers who help FCA carry out its vision. These include local Leadership Boards, Adult Booster Clubs and Adult Huddles. With innovative local community outreach events like golf scrambles and various college football bowl game breakfasts, we are constantly exploring new ways to tap into the popularity of sports and to share the power of God's love.
